We DO NOT cancel programs. We do have some alternate indoor activities to minimize outdoor time in the event of extreme weather conditions. Groups cancelling at least 14 days ahead of their program will not be charged. All groups failing to show or cancelling within 14 days will be charged 50% of the total fee.

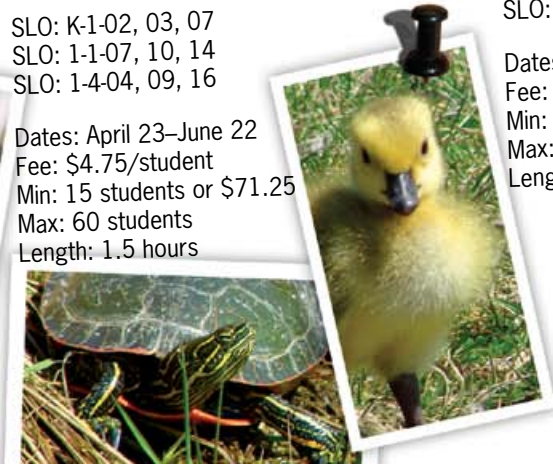

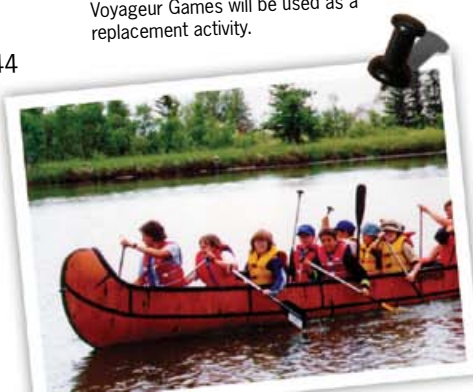


Grade 5–8 Le Voyageur

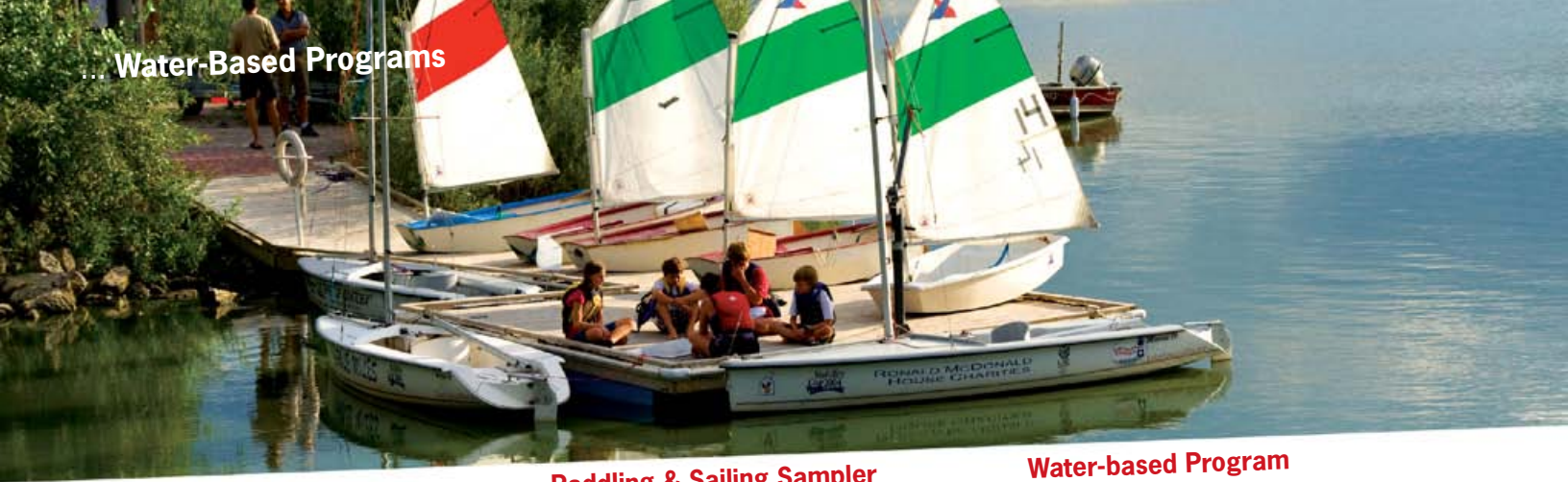

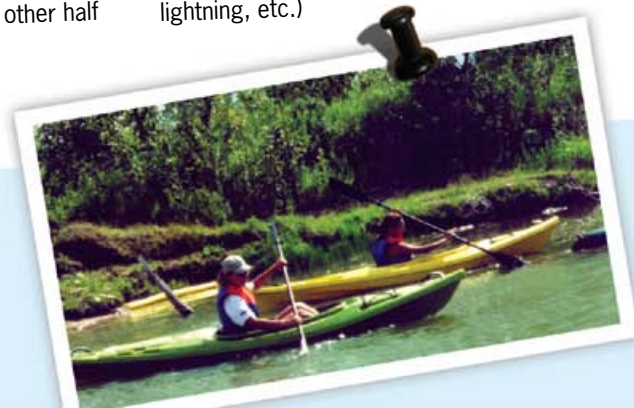
